PROFESSIONAL STAFF: QUALIFICATIONS AND SELECTION: RELIGIOUS EDUCATION POLICY GHB

STATEMENT OF POLICY

All professional staff shall possess formal training in religious education prior to or within the first two years of the commencement of her/his employment with Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools.

RATIONALE

Staff faith formation is central to the mission of Catholic education and is the most pressing and challenging task for Catholic school authorities.

GUIDELINES

- 1. Catholic Studies 105.3 and 106.3 meet the requirements of this policy.
- 2. Alternate training in religious studies may be approved as fulfilling the requirements of this policy.
- 3. Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools will provide support for the payment of tuition fees for staff enrolled in approved classes.

PROCEDURES

1. Documentation of the fulfillment of the requirements of this policy, requests for an adjudication of the same, and requests for reimbursement of tuition fees should be submitted to the Superintendent of Education, Human Resource Services Division.
