- English A30P and B30 and Français immersion 30P are offered.





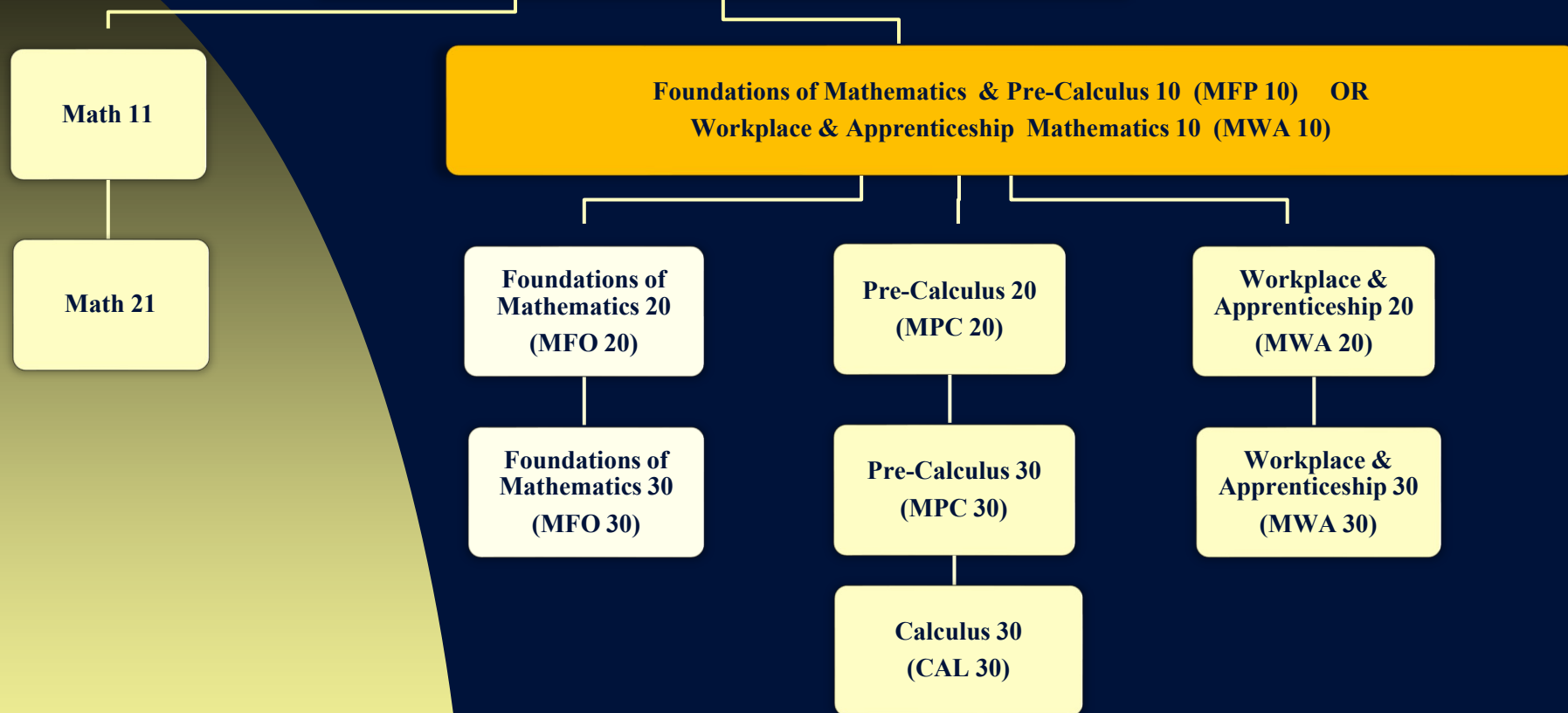

* Graduation requirement for Mathematics is any 20 level course.

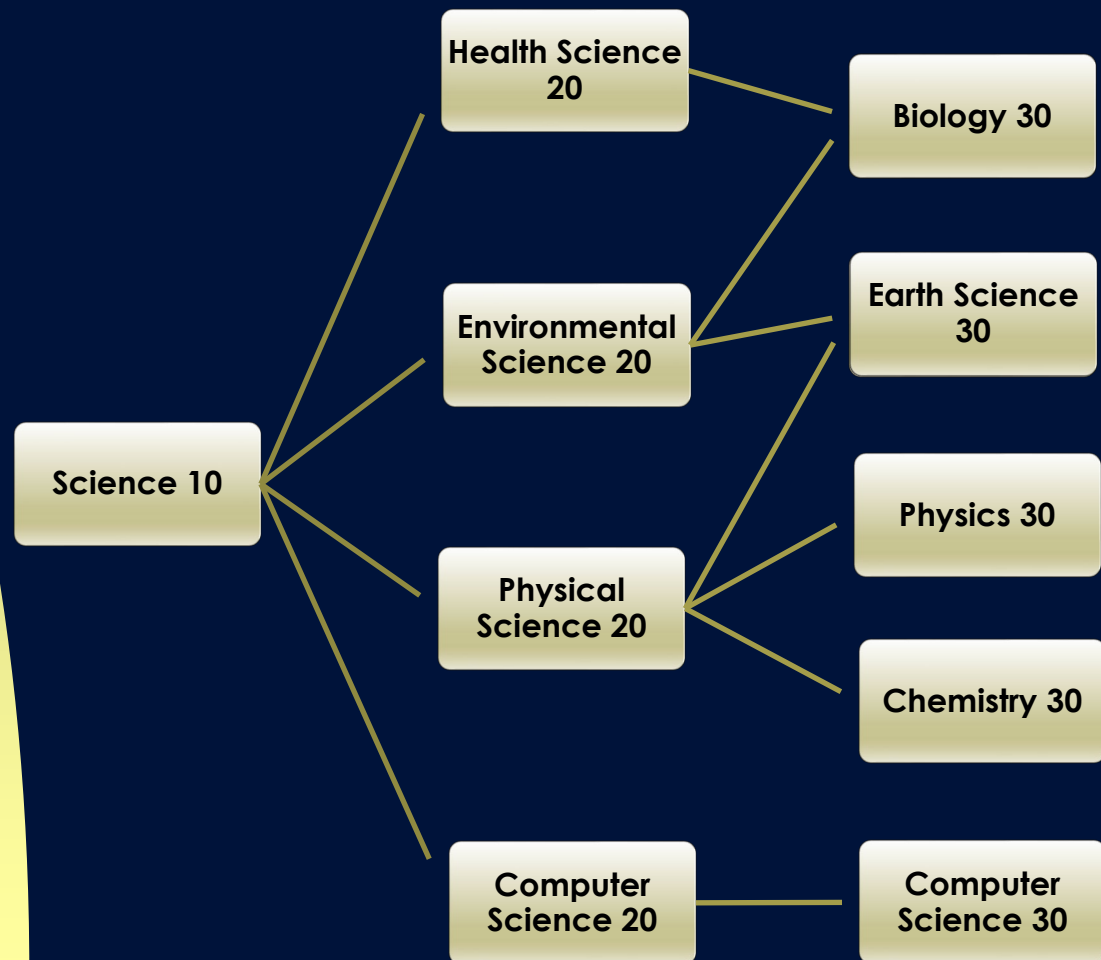
* Students can take more than one pathway at the 20 and 30 level.



Description: This course is designed to provide students with the mathematical understandings and entry into post-secondary programs that require the study of theoretical calculus. It is recommended that students who have achieved a mark of 65% or higher in Foundations and Pre-Calculus 10 to take this course. Topics include: value, radicals, trigonometry, rational expressions and equations, factoring, quadratic functions, inequalities, sequences and series, reciprocal functions.
