Shulich Scholarship application forms are now available on the bulletin board in Student Services. Schulich Leader Scholarships are Canada's most coveted undergraduate STEM scholarships. Fifty are awarded to entrepreneurial-minded high school graduates enrolling in a Science, Technology, Engineering or Math program at 20 partner universities across Canada. Twenty-five are valued at \$100,000 for engineering scholarships and 25 are valued at \$80,000* for science and math scholarships. *Applications are due by January 24th*, 2019.

<u>Terry Fox Humanitarian Award</u> Maximum award value is \$28,000 dispersed over four years. Although the Selection Committee will look for marks of distinction with regard to the persistent pursuit of excellence in academic, athletic, and civic life; these are not factors they weigh as heavily as humanitarianism. They are interested in students who demonstrate compassion and a keen commitment to easing the suffering of others, especially those who address critical needs in society.
