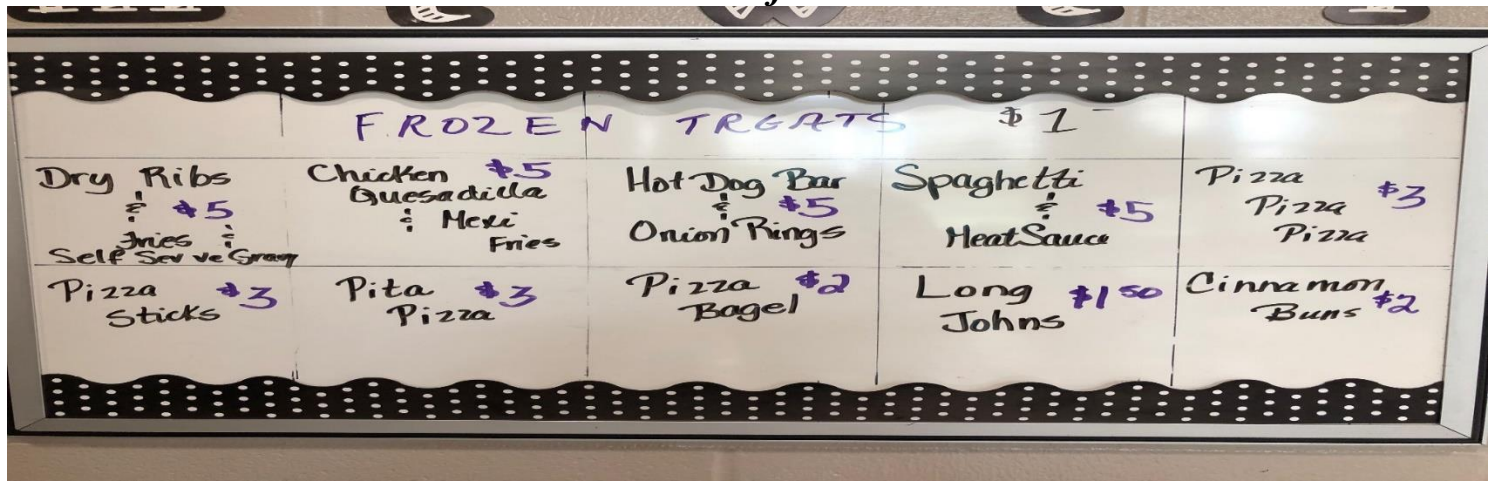

***CREATIVE SCHOLARSHIP through MC College** (\$1000) -To recognize High School students demonstrating outstanding creativity and community involvement and assist students in their endeavor to enter a career in the Salon or Spa Industry. Application forms are in Student Services.

Saskatchewan School Boards Association Scholarships: two \$2,500 scholarships are awarded to graduating high school students who remain in Saskatchewan in post-secondary study. One is a **University Scholarship:** \$2,500 for a student entering university in Saskatchewan. The other is an **Applied Science and Technology Scholarship:** \$2,500 for a student entering a recognized institute of applied science and technology in Saskatchewan. A 500-word essay is required (info on application form). Come to Student Services for more details. **Deadline: August 31, 2019**

The Saskatchewan Trucking Association (STA) Scholarship Program is designed to support those that are wishing to further their education into post-secondary. There are three (3) scholarships available: (1) \$3,000 and (2) \$1,000 awards. Our basic criteria are as follows: • Must be a dependent of an employee OR an employee of a STA member company • Application must be received no later than June 30, 2019 • High school graduate • Application is complete • Transcripts are received • Confirmation of application to a post-secondary institution Applicants that have been chosen to receive one of the three scholarships will be notified, in writing. These applicants are requested to be present at the STA's Annual Awards Banquet & Gala in October to be officially presented with the scholarship award. Drop by Student Services for an application.

National Union of Public and General Employees

Scholarships: Five (5) \$1,500 scholarships are available to Grade 12 students planning to **enter** the first year of a Canadian public post-secondary education institution fulltime in 2018. To be eligible, one of your parents/grandparents must belong to or be retired from one of the National Unions or affiliates – in Saskatchewan, SGEU. **Deadline: July 4, 2019.**

- 1) **Brian Fudge Memorial Scholarship:** Field of study in policing, criminal justice services, community services or health care (see above criteria as well)
- 2) **Scholarship for Students of Visible Minority** (see above criteria as well)
- 3) **Scholarship for Indigenous Students** (see above criteria as well)
- 4) **Tommy Douglas:** (See above eligibility that is in description)
- 5) **Terry Fox Memorial:** Any students with disabilities with parents/grandparents that are(were) members of National Union of Public and General Employees
